Plymouth-Canton Community Schools Operating Millage Renewal Proposal

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all on all property, except principal resi-dence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its full foundation allowance per pupil under Proposal A. The remaining 2 mills are only available to be levied to restore millage lost as a result of a "Headlee" rollback and will only e levied to the extent necessary to restore that rollback.

Pursuant to state law, the revenue raised by the proposed enhancement millage will be collected by the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency and Distributed to local public school districts within the boundaries of the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency based on pupil membership count.
