AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 82 - CONDOMINIUMS, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON, MICHIGAN REGARDING BUFFER LANDSCAPING AND STREET TREE REQUIREMENTS. THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON ORDAINS: PART I. CHAPTER 82 — CONDOMINIUMS * * * ARTICLE III. DESIGN STANDARDS Sec. 82-130. Street Trees.** (6) Trees must be replaced by the contractor if the trees are not in a healthy condition after one full growing season. After the initial warranty period, the condominium unit owner is responsible for maintaining the tree(s), including pruning and replacement as necessary. **Sec. 82-131. Buffer Landscaping.** Berms shall be planted as follows: A minimum of one shade tree and two evergreen trees shall be planted for each 40 lineal feet, or portion thereof, of road frontage. In addition, a minimum of one ornamental tree shall be planted for each 80 lineal feet, or portion thereof, of road frontage; plus a minimum of one shrub shall be planted for each ten feet, or portion thereof, of road frontage. For the purpose of computing length of road frontage, openings for driveways and sidewalks shall not be counted. The landscape plan prepared in accordance with the informational requirements of this chapter shall show the trees and shrubs planted at uniform intervals, at random, or in groups. **PART II. Severability.** Should any section, subdivision, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or in part, shall not be affected other than the part invalidated. **PART III. Savings Clause.** The amendment of the Canton Code of Ordinances set forth in this Ordinance does not affect or impair any act done, offense committed, or right accruing, accrued, or acquired, or liability, penalty, forfeiture or punishment, pending or incurred prior to the amendment of the Canton Code of Ordinances set forth in this Ordinance. **PART IV. Repealer.** All other Ordinances or part of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent to give this Ordinance full force and effect. **PART V. Publication.** The Clerk for the Charter Township of Canton shall cause the ordinance to be published in the manner required by law. **Part VI.
